

Save money on your Medicare-covered insulin

You'll pay no more than \$35 for a one-month supply of each covered insulin, and you won't have to pay a deductible for each covered insulin.



There are 2 ways that Medicare covers insulin:



Drug coverage (Part D)

Part D covers injectable insulin that isn't used with a traditional insulin pump and insulin that's inhaled or used with a disposable pump.

Note: If your Part D plan covers disposable insulin patch pumps, the pump might cost more than \$35.



Part B (Medical Insurance) or Medicare Advantage (Part C)

Part B covers insulin if you use an insulin pump that's covered through the Part B durable medical equipment benefit. Medicare Advantage Plans cover insulin.
